Report of the Meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee of the North Atlantic Salmon Conservation Organization Westcourt Hotel, Drogheda, Ireland 3 – 5 June 2013

1. Opening of the Meeting

- 1.1 The Chairman, Mr Raoul Bierach (Norway), opened the meeting and welcomed members of the Committee to Drogheda.
- 1.2 A list of participants is contained in Annex 1.

2. Adoption of the Agenda

2.1 The Committee adopted its agenda, FAC(13)5 (Annex 2).

3. 2012 Audited Accounts

- 3.1 The Interim Secretary introduced the audited accounts for 2012, FAC(13)2. The Council had decided to change auditors for the 2012 accounts. He indicated that Chiene and Tait had completed the audit effectively and, as required, the accounts had been issued to the Parties by 15 February 2013. The 2012 budget had allowed for the use of the Organization's reserves held in the Working Capital Fund (up to £150,000) and the Contractual Obligation Fund (up to £45,050). The accounts confirm that it was not necessary to use the full amount of Working Capital (£147,995 was required) and the Contractual Obligation Fund was not used at all.
- 3.2 The Committee recommended to the Council the adoption of the 2012 audited accounts.
- The President referred to a management letter that had been received from Chiene and Tait concerning the Staff Fund Rules, the potential of retention of Secretariat status for former employees, and the reference to a special review. These matters were discussed by the Heads of Delegations and the FAC. It was decided that the Parties will draft questions for Chiene and Tait regarding the scope of the analysis of the Staff Fund and retention of Secretariat status for former employees. Parties will also submit questions to seek clarification from Chiene and Tait on the products and cost of their conducting a special review. All questions to be submitted will be circulated to the Parties. The Interim Secretary would then relay these questions to Chiene and Tait on behalf of NASCO. The Interim Secretary will provide the response from Chiene and Tait to the Heads of Delegations who will then take a decision on how they would like to proceed. In the event that Chiene and Tait are unable to address all of the questions, then alternative arrangements will be considered by the Parties.

4. Relationship with ICES

- 4.1 In 2007, the Council had entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with ICES that is subject to review every three years. In 2010, the Council had agreed to continue with the MoU.
- 4.2 The Committee recommended that the MoU with ICES continue for a further period of three years on the understanding that, during this period, there should be no increase in costs above the rate of inflation in Denmark. The Interim Secretary indicated that he had raised with ICES the possibility of receiving the advice earlier than the date specified in the MoU (10 May). The Committee asked that he continue to liaise with ICES on this matter, noting that it is particularly important to receive the advice early in years when catch advice is provided to inform negotiations of regulatory measures.

5. Consideration of the 2014 Draft Budget, Schedule of Contributions and five-year Budgeting Plan

- 5.1 The Interim Secretary introduced the Draft 2014 Budget, FAC(13)3. Last year, the Committee had requested that a more detailed break-down of the planned expenditure be shown within budget heads and the Secretariat had, therefore, developed a new format for the 2014 Draft Budget which the Committee welcomed. Following announcement that the Interim Secretary had been appointed as Secretary from 1 July 2013, a revised budget was developed. This budget assumed that because there would be no need to use the funds available in the 2013 Budget for relocation expenses, there would be a surplus at the end of the year which could be paid into the Working Capital Fund. The sums that had been budgeted for 2014 (£50,000) and 2015 (£50,000) for the Working Capital Fund had, therefore, been removed from the revised budget. The Committee also agreed that the loan from the Board (£25,000) should be repaid in full in 2014.
- 5.2 The Committee agreed to recommend to the Council the adoption of the revised 2014 Draft Budget and 2015 Forecast Budget, FAC(13)8. The budget as adopted by the Council, CNL(13)37, is included in Annex 3, together with a five-year budgeting plan (2014 2018) that was provided for information.
- 5.3 The representative of the US thanked the Interim Secretary for providing salary information and asked that this information continue to be given to the Committee with the annual budget proposal, on a confidential basis, in future.

6. MoU with the OSPAR Commission

6.1 In 2011, the OSPAR Commission had proposed that an MoU be agreed with NASCO. A Draft MoU, which had been developed by the OSPAR Commission, was considered at the Committee's 2012 Meeting. The Committee had developed a shorter, simplified text and it was agreed to resolve the matter inter-sessionally. Following further simplification of the text by the Secretariat, the MoU was agreed inter-sessionally by NASCO Heads of Delegations and sent to OSPAR whose Jurists and Linguists had made only minor editorial changes.

6.2 The Interim Secretary introduced document FAC(13)4, which contained the revised draft MoU with OSPAR. The Committee agreed the Draft MoU and recommended that it be adopted by the Council and sent to the OSPAR Commission for consideration at its Annual Meeting. Once the MoU has been accepted by the OSPAR Commission, it would then be signed by the President on behalf of NASCO. The Draft MoU (FAC(13)9) is contained in Annex 4.

7. Appointment of Auditors

7.1 The Committee noted that last year, the Council had agreed to appoint Chiene and Tait of Dublin Street, Edinburgh, as auditors for the 2012, 2013 and 2014 audited accounts.

8. Any Other Business

8.1 The Committee asked that the Secretariat obtain a quotation for re-printing the Handbook of Basic Texts and consult with the Parties so that a decision can be taken on whether or not to proceed.

9. Report of the Meeting

- 9.1 The Committee agreed a report of its meeting.
- 9.2 The Chair thanked the members of the Committee for their contributions and closed the meeting.
- 9.3 A list of Finance and Administration Committee papers is given in Annex 5.

Draft Memorandum of Understanding between the North Atlantic Salmon Conservation Organization and the OSPAR Commission

The North Atlantic Salmon Conservation Organization (hereinafter 'NASCO') and the Commission established by the 1992 Convention for the Protection of the Marine Environment of the North-East Atlantic (hereinafter 'OSPAR Commission') have complementary competences, for the conservation and rational management of Atlantic salmon and for the protection of marine ecosystems, respectively, in the North-East Atlantic, including in areas beyond national jurisdiction.

RECOGNISING that under the Convention for the Conservation of Salmon in the North Atlantic Ocean:

- NASCO's objective is to contribute to the conservation, restoration, enhancement and rational management of salmon stocks in the North Atlantic Ocean, through consultation and cooperation, taking into account the best scientific evidence available to it;
- NASCO seeks to promote the acquisition, analysis and dissemination of scientific information pertaining to salmon stocks in the North Atlantic Ocean.

RECOGNISING that under the Convention for the Protection of the Marine Environment of the North-East Atlantic:

- The Contracting Parties to the OSPAR Convention agreed to take necessary measures
 to protect the maritime area against adverse effects of human activities so as to
 safeguard human health and to conserve marine ecosystems and the biological
 diversity of the maritime area and, when practicable, restore marine areas which have
 been adversely affected;
- The OSPAR Commission aims for the application of an integrated ecosystem approach.

NOTING that both the OSPAR Commission and NASCO have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with ICES for scientific information and advice.

NASCO and the OSPAR Commission have reached the following understanding:

- 1. The Secretariats of NASCO and the OSPAR Commission will invite each other to participate as observers in meetings of common interest that they each may organize;
- 2. The Secretariats of NASCO and the OSPAR Commission will communicate, as necessary, to share information, including annual reports and data and, where appropriate, coordinate on matters concerning the conservation and rational management of Atlantic salmon and the protection of marine ecosystems in the North-East Atlantic;
- 3. The Secretariats of NASCO and the OSPAR Commission will report to their respective organizations on the actions each has taken pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding;

4. Cooperation on specific issues within the scope of this Memorandum of Understanding may, if necessary, be specified in further detail through the development of separate sub-arrangements between NASCO and the OSPAR Commission.

This Memorandum of Understanding will come into effect following its signature by both Parties.

It may be terminated by either signatory by giving six months' written notice to the other signatory, prior to the proposed date of termination.

This Memorandum of Understanding may be modified by written, mutual consent, subject to approval by NASCO and the OSPAR Commission.
