The new Government of Greenland Executive Order on Salmon Fisheries have improved the reporting, the Greenland Fisheries License Control Authority (GFLK) now receives more, better and improved information on the Greenlandic salmon fishery.

2: Stock status and catches.

2.1 Provide a description of any significant changes in the status of stocks relative to the reference points described in the Implementation Plan and of any new factors which may significantly affect the abundance of salmon stocks.

The status of the Kapisillit River is unknown. The ICES advice on stock status for 2014 will not be available until May 2014 but the Framework of Indicators does not show that there has been a significant change in the indicators used.

Recent investigations (2011 and 2012) have revealed the existence of several year-classes of smolts in the Kapisillit river, and the stock persists (unpublished).

Current quantity is 1 river (Kapisillit). The genetic investigations of the local Greenlandic stock is awaiting publication.

The Ministry of Fisheries, Hunting and Agriculture is currently in a process of updating the regulatory measures. The plan is to revise the reporting from the wildlife officers and to make the restrictions more tight.
