No changes have been made to the Implementation Plan during 2014.

1.2 Describe any major new initiatives or achievements for salmon conservation and management that you wish to highlight.

Greenland Fisheries License Control Authority (GFLK) has conducted a phone survey after the fishing season 2014 ended in order to control the reporting and to assist the licensed fishermen in reporting the new requirements correctly. The phone survey was planned together with the Ministry of Fisheries, Hunting and Agriculture and the Greenland Institute of Natural Resources.

The Framework of Indicators does not show that there has been a significant change in the indicators used, thus there have been no changes to the status of the stock. The status of the Kapisillit River is unknown.

Action Description of Action Evaluation of the reporting system implemented in F1: 2012 through the new Government of Greenland (as submitted in the IP): Executive Order on Salmon Fisheries. **Expected Outcome** Improved reporting and data. (as submitted in the IP): Progress on Action to Date The evaluation has shown an improvement in data, (see note above): however, it takes time to get the fishermen to fill it out correctly. The requirements apply to all fishermen; licensed and unlicensed. In 2015, a phone survey was conducted by the GFLK talking to the licensed fishermen about their reports and this, has increased the awareness of the way to fill out reports as wells as improving the reporting for 2014. It is planned to carry out a similar phone survey after the 2015 season. The evaluation of the requirements will continue till 2015 as planned in order to ensure as nuanced an evaluation as possible. Description of Action Action In July 2012 a quota for landings to fish factories in F2: (as submitted in the IP): the internal-use only fishery was set. Review and revise as necessary the quota. **Expected Outcome** Improved control of the harvest/fishery. (as submitted in the IP): Progress on Action to Date The landing quota of 35 tonnes were not utilized in the (see note above): first two years and thus, the quota was reduced to 30 tonnes in 2014. The biological data that is used for the review is the ICES advice and data. However, the needs of the Greenlandic people are the most important as the Greenlandic salmon fishery is a substance fishery for internal-use only. Current Status of Action Ongoing.
