1.2 Describe any major new initiatives or achievements for salmon conservation and management that you wish to highlight.	
In 2016, a parr and smolt-monitoring program of the kapisillit river was initiated. Electrofishing and mark recapture experiments in the river indicated that although high, the number of parr and smolt is smaller than similar investigations performed in 1959. The Greenland Institute of Natural resources will start up a yearly monitoring program from 2018.

Action F1:	Description of Action <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	Evaluation of the reporting system implemented in 2012 through the new Government of Greenland Executive Order on Salmon Fisheries.
	Expected Outcome <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	Improved reporting and data.
	Progress on Action to Date <i>(Provide a brief overview with a quantitative measure of progress. Other material (e.g. website links) will not be evaluated.)</i>	The Executive Order was amended in 2015 following the adoption of a new multi-annual regulatory measure in that year. Since 2015, the hunting officers from the Greenland fisheries license control authority has increased their activities related to salmon. Activities has involved meetings with fishermen and the public in cities/towns and settlements, patrolling the known salmon fishery sites, conducting direct control of fishermen on the fishing grounds and removal of gillnets that were not in accordance with regulations. Furthermore, since 2015, phone surveys of the licensed fishermen have been carried out annually. It is expected that these actions will also improve knowledge about regulations, decrease non-reported catches and improve our knowledge about un-reported catch in the licensed segment. In spite of the survey and the increased information effort, the reporting percentage for the licensed

		fishermen segment is still only around 30 %. However, the estimate of unreported catch from the licensed fishermen decreased from 20 t in the 2014 season, to 5 t in 2015 and 4.25 t in the 2016 season. No estimate is available for the 2017 season. The phone interviews have also indicated that the majority of the fishermen that failed to report catch had only minor or no salmon catch to report.

Action H1:	Description of Action <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	A protection plan for the Kapisillit River stock and entire river area is currently undergoing a hearing process.
	Expected Outcome <i>(as submitted in the IP)</i>	Protection of the entire river area including adjacent estuarine area from anthropogenic effects (pollution, development, agriculture and gillnetting) and specifying rules of public access (including fishery).
	Progress on Action to Date <i>(Provide a brief overview with a quantitative measure of progress. Other material (e.g. website links) will not be evaluated.)</i>	There are no obvious human disturbances to the Kapisillit river. Initial steps towards a protection plan for the Kapisillit River was previously initiated. However, there has been no further progress. The protection plan is still not implemented and the process seems to have stopped. There is currently no legislative protection of the Kapisillit river salmon stock and no management measures for the stock has not been set. Recent investigations indicate a reduced genetic variability and reduced parr and smolt production in

		the stock compared to the 1950's, thus indicating that the current fishing pressure is too high.
