EU: exclusive competence on marine fisheries

Member States: retain shared competence on

- 1. Aquaculture
- 2. Inland fisheries

and under some conditions:

- 3. Coastal fisheries within 12 nautical miles
- → The EU still has something to say on some aspects

EU Ireland

Gear: Draft nets, Snap nets

Catch: 2,595 salmon (approximately 7t)

Location: Three estuaries:

Bangor (Tullaghan Bay) Mixed Stock Fishery (Owenmore and Owenduff rivers) – mean 5Yr catch = 1,423 salmon.

Ballinakill (Killary harbour) Mixed Stock Fishery (Erriff and Bundurragha rivers) – mean 5 Yr catch = 402 salmon.

Castlemaine Mixed Stock Fishery (Laune, Caragh and Maine rivers) – mean 2 Yr catch = 771 salmon.



EU Denmark

Gear: The only important fishery targeting salmon outside the Baltic Sea is sports fishing in rivers.

Catch: Salmon by-catch in other fisheries is less than 100 kg according to the official fishery catch statistics

Location: No targeted mixed stock fishery.



EU Finland

Gear: Traditional and semi-commercial netting methods and rods in the main stem fisheries of the River Teno

Catch: c. 60-100 metric tonnes (main stem of the Teno, Finland and Norway combined)

Location: The main stem fishery of the River Teno is exploiting some 30 tributary populations.



EU Sweden (1)

Gear: four commercial trapnet fisheries
-one commercial gill-net fishery. The gill-net fishery
are considered mixed stock fisheries targeting wild
and reared salmon

Catch: 2007-2011 average catch 2.1 t. Also within the three river systems with releases of reared salmon, the proportion of wild salmon is low (<5%). The five year average salmon catch in these rivers has been 15.6 tonnes in total, but the number of wild salmon below 780 kg.



EU Sweden (2)

Location: The commercial coastal gill-net fishery is a mixed stock fishery. Also within the three river systems with releases of reared salmon there is a mixed stock fishing on wild and reared salmon



EU UK (England & Wales)

Gear, catch and location:

Three remaining MSFs subject to phase-out arrangements in England and Wales

mean annual catches of salmon (in numbers) in 2007-11 were:

Anglian Coast: drift nets – mean catch 5 salmon Severn Estuary: putchers, lave nets and draft nets – mean catch 568 salmon

North East Coast: driftnets and T&J nets – mean catch 12,585



EU UK (Scotland)

Gear: fixed engines (coastal nets)

Catch: Mean catch taken in mixed-stock fisheries in the last 5 years (2007 - 2011) = 39.6 tonnes.

Location: coastlines



EU UK (Northern Ireland)

Gear: draft-, drift-, and bagnets

Catch: Mean catch taken in commercial fisheries in the last 5 years (2007 – 2011) = 6.9 tonnes

Location: coast and estuaries
