Regulations for fishing in 2020 included some restrictions on the season duration not reported in last APR because of its limited scope. These restrictions have been extended almost everywhere in 2021, limiting the salmon season to 2 months (May-June) instead of three (to the end of July) and banning fishing for all species from the first of July in salmon reaches, where in some cases sea-trout season extended to the end of September in previous. The aim of these regulations is to reduce fishing effort (about 1/3) and to protect salmon preventing by-catching and unwanted injuries.

MIGRAMINHO interreg project will be concluded in 2021, with quite interesting results and a relevant recommendations on fishery regulations that are expected to be applied along the next years in Spain and Portugal.
