

***Forty-Third Annual Meeting of the North American Commission******Macdonald Aviemore Resort, Scotland******2 – 5 June 2026******Annotated Agenda***

The purpose of this paper is to provide the background, links to papers and decisions for each item on the Agenda for the Meeting of the North American Commission.

This Annotated Agenda references papers that the Secretariat is aware of at the time of writing. If additional papers are issued, they will be posted on the website and delegates will be informed by email.

As agreed in 2022, Parties / NGOs were invited to submit questions on Agenda items, in advance to the relevant Commission member. Under NASCO's new T&Cs for accredited observers, Indigenous Peoples' representatives and institutions (IPRIs) are now able to attend NASCO meetings and in 2025, Council agreed, [CNL\(25\)80rev](#), paragraph 2.10, it would be happy to include a provision for IPRIs to ask questions in advance, in addition to Parties and NGOs. The Secretariat requested that it be copied into any questions asked, to allow the questions to be included in the Annotated Agenda. No questions were received.

A summary of the decisions before the Commission is contained in Annex 1.

Order of Business

Business will be taken in the order in the Agenda.

1. Opening of the Meeting

The Chair, Dale Marsden (Canada), will open the meeting.

Members of the Commission, NGOs and IPRIs may make verbal Opening Statements, as is usual in years when new regulatory measures are negotiated.

2. Adoption of the Agenda

A Provisional Agenda, [NAC\(26\)01](#), was issued on 9 February 2026. No supplementary items were proposed by the Parties. The Draft Agenda, [NAC\(26\)02](#), was issued on 10 April.

4. Report of the ICES Advisory Committee on Salmon Stocks in the Commission Area

In 2022 the Council agreed that full ICES Advice should be presented in Council only in future, [CNL\(22\)53rev](#), paragraph 4.34. Therefore, there will be no presentation of ICES advice during the Commission meeting.

However, Article 9 of the Convention states that ‘*In exercising the functions set out in articles 7 and 8, a Commission shall take into account: the best available information, including advice from the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea and other appropriate scientific organizations...*’

This agenda item allows for questions and comment on the ICES Advice, if required. The Chair of the Working Group on North Atlantic Salmon (WGNAS), Alan Walker (UK), will be available to answer questions, if required.

5. Mixed-Stock Fisheries Conducted by Members of the Commission

This is essential business under Articles 7 and 15 of the Convention. Article 7 states that ‘*The functions of the North American Commission with regard to its area shall be: (a) to provide a forum for consultation and co-operation between the members: (i) on matters related to minimizing catches in the area of fisheries jurisdiction of one member of salmon originating in the rivers of another Party...*’

Additionally, in 2024, the Council agreed, [CNL\(24\)88rev](#), paragraph 6.12, to include an agenda item in each of the Commissions to allow for an annual update on coastal, estuarine and in-river mixed-stock fisheries and the justification for their continued prosecution. Each member of the Commission with mixed-stock fisheries (MSF) was requested to provide papers in 2026 with a brief description of any mixed-stock fisheries still operating, the most recent catch data for these fisheries, any changes or developments in their management **and the justification for their continued prosecution.**

There are no directed wild Atlantic salmon fisheries in the United States, so no report will be provided under this Agenda item by the United States.

6. The St Pierre and Miquelon Salmon Fishery

In recent years, the Council and the North American Commission have been concerned about catches of salmon at St Pierre and Miquelon which, although low, occur at a time

when there are serious concerns about the abundance of North American stocks and when strict harvest restrictions have been introduced throughout the North American Commission area.

In 2023, the Council again agreed to write to France (in respect of St Pierre and Miquelon), to invite them to join NASCO. The [Letter from the President of NASCO](#) to the Secretary of State of the Sea was sent on 20 March 2024. France (in respect of St Pierre and Miquelon) has provided a Report on the 2025 Salmon Fishery at St Pierre and Miquelon.

7. Salmonid Introductions and Transfers

Under Article 7 of the Convention, the Williamsburg Resolution, and the NAC protocols, Members of the Commission must report on salmonid introductions and transfers. In 2010, it was agreed that the Parties should provide focused annual reports to the Commission on issues of mutual concern including salmonid disease incidences, breaches of containment, introductions from outside the Commission area and transgenics.

8. Recommendations to the Council on the Request to ICES for Scientific Advice

This item is required under Article 9 of the Convention which requires a Commission to take into account the best scientific evidence. Advice is provided annually under the [ICES / NASCO Memorandum of Understanding](#).

In 1992, the Council established a Standing Scientific Committee (SSC) to assist the Council and Commissions in formulating their questions to ICES. During the Annual Meeting, the SSC will meet to develop a Draft Request for Scientific Advice from ICES for consideration by the Commissions and the Council. The SSC comprises two representatives from each Commission, ideally one scientist and one manager. During the Annual Meeting, the SSC will meet to develop a Draft Request for Scientific Advice from ICES for consideration by the Commissions and the Council. The SSC representatives for the North American Commission are Tim Sheehan and Julien April.

The Standing Scientific Committee's recommendations will be available once its work is complete.

- *the Commission will be asked to consider the relevant section of the SSC's recommendation, although it may wish to defer the decision to the Council.*
